**Observations:** Subject experienced extremely rapid bone growth, with osseous tissue erupting from the limbs and torso. Bone growth continued at a rate of 10cm / hour, slowing only when the distal ends reached the walls and ceiling of the hospital room. Exposed bones bore superficial resemblance to human tibia or ulna, but with curved thorns along sides.

Subject expressed high degree of pain and discomfort, painkillers having limited effect. Surgical staff sought approval for anaesthesia and amputation of growths. Approval remained pending when subject was discovered deceased with severe tearing to wrists and throat. Wounds appeared to be self-inflicted using thorns on exposed bone tissue.
